efore I begin my article for this month, I want you to know that I do not profess to have all the answers or know all the answers. I'm not an economist, but I know the economy is bad. I'm not a business owner, but I know businesses are laying off good workers at an alarming rate in North Carolina.

For these reasons, I would like to share with you what I believe is a word of comfort from our Lord. In

Hebrews 13:5-6 (NLT), the author of this book tells us to, "Stay away from the love of money; be satisfied with what you have. For God has said, 'I will never fail you. I will never forsake you.' That is why we can say with confidence, 'The Lord is my helper, so I will not be afraid. What can mere mortals do to me?'"

In these final words from the author, the message is one of hope, but he also warns the early Christians of the pitfalls in life that could potentially hurt their witness for Christ. The love of money was a major pitfall.

Am I suggesting bad things have happened to decent people because of their love of money? Certainly not. Do I believe people have lost their jobs or homes because they weren't satisfied with what they had? Absolutely not. I'm merely attempting to point our attention to the One who can calm all fears and take away the worries of life that can plague us daily.

However, I do think this nation's love for money has "short-changed" our faith. There are Christians who believe if we have enough money in the bank account then we're going to be alright. I believe that's a false truth and we must be careful not to fall into such a trap. Yes, money is necessary to buy food, gas, keep a roof over our heads, and clothe our families, but money is not our Savior.

The author of Hebrews quotes two Old Testament passages to remind God's children of His promise to never fail them nor forsake them (Deut. 31:6,8) and how the Lord will help his children and they should not fear any trial or tribulation implemented by humanity (Ps. 188:6).

When times are tough, God will embrace us. When times seem hard, God's comfort is abundant. When things are difficult, God promises an easy yoke. I'm not suggesting that life is easy. On the contrary, life can be cruel sometimes. Life can play tricks on our minds and weigh heavy on our faith. In those times remember the words in Hebrews that God will never fail us, and because we're one of His, we have nothing to fear.

May our love for God and each other carry us through the rough spots of life so when we emerge on the other side of the refiner's fire, God will look at us and say, "Well done you good and faithful servant." I pray God's watch care over each and every one of us as we travel the days ahead, and remember – God will never abandon us.


